SHOWMANSHIP WORKSHOP

- Ensure bird has been prepared (bathed week before show, freshly watered, etc).
- Appearance of bird (neat, clean, no parasites/bugs).
- Appearance (neat, dress code for poultry show).
- How to walk into show ring properly carrying a bird
- How to look for directions from the judge
- How to properly greet a judge
- How to properly put animal into showmanship cage/area
- How to act while waiting for your turn with judge
- How to properly remove bird from cage
- How to hand bird to judge
- Take bird back from judge face first
- How to open wings while holding bird
- Don't be shy while talking to judge.
 - 1. Tell the judge everything you know about your bird
- Questions a judge might ask for beginners:
 - 1. Breed and variety of bird
 - 2. Sex of bird and how to tell
 - 3. Name some parts of the bird (hand outs)
 - 4. Type of comb (hand out)
 - 5. Questions about basic management & responsibilities
 - 6. Purpose of bird
- Questions a judge might ask for intermediates:
 - Passing the bird
 - 2. Purpose of bird
 - 3. Examining the wings, under color, feet and head
 - 4. Questions about poultry diseases and parasites
 - 5. Questions on disqualifications or defects and additional anatomy
 - 6. What does grit and oyster shell do and where does it work at?
 - 7. Basic knowledge of incubation

- Questions a judge might ask a senior:
 - 1. Should know an expanded vocabulary and terms and definitions
 - 2. What is duck foot?
 - 3. Know all comb types and feather patterns (hen feathering and frizzle feathering)
 - 4. Know squirrel tail and rye tail
 - 5. Classes in APA and ABA with examples
 - 6. Know which birds have 5 toes
 - 7. Identify other breeds of birds in show
 - 8. Know disqualifications
 - 9. Know history and all varieties of your bird
 - 10. Advanced knowledge of incubation
- Follow judge's directions and wait until your group is dismissed from show ring.
- No two judges will ask the same questions.
